Ukraine needs trucks

We donate and deliver them

DURING WW2, the good people of **Brixham** came together and stood against tyranny in defence of our lands and our freedoms. Ukrainians are fighting for their land and their freedoms today.

BASED IN STOKE GABRIEL on the banks of the River Dart, **Team Devon** drive a convoy of trucks every 6 -8 weeks to Ukraine and is the most prolific supporter of the UK charity UKRAINIAN ACTION

UKRAINIAN ACTION. Under the umbrella of the national charity, **Team Devon** fundraise to purchase and deliver vital 4x4 trucks (sometimes ambulances and vans), all loaded with humanitarian aid that is collected locally in South Devon.

73 Humanitarian convoys from UK to UKRAINE

374 Vehicles donated and delivered

61 Vehicles donated and delivered by TEAM DEVON since March 2022

ALL VEHICLES packed with humanitarian aid, collected locally

DONATED VEHICLES are used for civilian evacuations from front line regions

OUR VEHICLES save 10 lives each (on average)

UKRAINIAN ACTION is 100% volunteer run

Donated 4x4 vehicles are used for medical and civilian evacuations in front-line areas of the war in Ukraine. They need to be able to traverse destroyed roads and go off-road to avoid drone patrolled routes. All are loaded with aid donated locally in South Devon (typically, generators, fire extinguishers, mobility aids, medical aid, rescue equipment, toiletries and personal hygiene products).



The trucks we supply save 10 lives on average. In one day during February 2025, the Ford Ranger shown below, that Team Devon delivered in June 2024, saved 200 lives!



Vlad (surname withheld) is an incredibly brave man. Since 2014, when Russia invaded and annexed Crimea, he has been rescuing terrified, infirm, elderly people, left behind in the bombed out communities in front line towns and villages. He had used a clearly marked minibus until it was blown up by a Russian drone in February 2025. TEAM DEVON vowed to help Vlad. A replacement (with rear wheelchair lift) was funded and delivered by Team Devon to the front-line city of Zaporizhzhia, just 5 weeks later.
